

## Ministry Report: Summary of BUR Outreach for 2010

We are now in our 2<sup>nd</sup> year of sowing into a regional prayer community in the Fort Mill area. After 4 months we conducted a music & worship symposium. For 8 months we opened our home weekly for Friday night worship & dinners. We helped formalize a youth expression of the community. We provided leadership/organization for 3 large community gatherings (coinciding with the 3 main Feasts of the Lord): Passover, Pentecost and Tabernacles. These helped to kick-off two 24/3 prayer “bursts” in a strategic trans-local church, spanning 72 hours of live continuous worship & prayer. Now after 12 months, a true cross-current of prayer expressions appear to be partnering with this trans-local church (Morning Star) for the single purpose of 24/7 worship & prayer! BUR also conducted outreach to 8 local church expressions in New Orleans, Florida, South/North Carolina, Maryland and New Jersey. Outreach included evangelism on the Beach, ministry to the Lord in prayer & teaching a musical skill enhancement workshop.

### **Winter Tour Highlights**

This past Dec/January we ministered in St. Petersburg (FL), Penney Farms (near Jacksonville) and the Leesburg Vineyard (FL). Each time we combined music and spontaneous worship. We sensed a strong sense of God's presence in each place, especially among the youth and children. *In one service, as we played, a young man fell to the ground convulsing. He was totally delivered from demonic oppression as we simply worshipped Jesus with our instruments!*

### **Co-Sponsored “New Sounds” Symposium**

As we helped give form to a remnant prayer community (after ZHOP closed in Oct 2009), we committed to help lead this little community for 4 months of "listening prayer". At the end of this listening time, on the last week in January, we co-hosted a symposium (in Fort Mill, SC) on the new sounds of heaven as we partnered with our dear friend, Sandy Lindsay, a seasoned intercessor in the Spirit (Spiritual Meat Ministries). One of the highlights was to connect the Moravian revival with the composers Bach & Handel. The Lord is releasing new sounds from heaven as well as new songs and gifts of artistic & musical composition. This weekend was just the beginning.

### **Playing in Holy Ghost Town: Brock Offertory at Morning Star Ministries (Feb 21)**

On Sunday, February 21, our family was invited to play for the offertory at Morning Star (MS) as well as join in the worship for the morning services. On many levels, this was a strategic service at MS and marked the beginning of an even greater “Open Heaven” season in the region. This was also the last day of the Holy Spirit Conference!

### **Fort Mill Prayer Community: Large Gatherings (24/3 Prayer Bursts)**

After 8 months of soaking prayer in homes, with worship gatherings every Friday night, we felt led to meet at the Cause building for a Passover Seder meal. The "Old Cause" building (nestled on former PTL lake) is where young people from Morning Star, The Cause and ZHOP all launched 24/7 in Jan 06. In April & May, God opened the door for the PC to meet and re-dig an old well in the Spirit. At the same time, the Holy Spirit indicated that roles, locations were changing. The next day an opportunity came to renew our same lease in a larger home, more suitable for teaching & meetings! See more below:

#### April—May 2010:

- *Passover Seder at the Old Cause Bldg:* 100 gathered for a detailed Passover teaching & meal. Afterwards, the youth led in prophetic worship & interactive singing of the scriptures—and no one wanted to leave—the river was flowing!
- *Pentecost Picnic:* About a month later (after a quick move ☺) we met again at the Old Cause Bldg and the youth picked up where they left off, joined by seasoned intercessors and firey young singers. The children jumped on stage and began to dance. We sensed God's passion for re-establishing a resting place for His glory.
- *24/7 Watch @ Morning Star (MS):* The following week, MS head intercessors initiated a 24/7 Watch to run concurrent with the MS Worship & Warfare Conf. (72 hours straight) Many of us joined, in music and prayer. The PC youth took several mid-night sets. Our family (incling student/friends) played afternoon sets. The conference was charged with a true Heart of David impartation! (Key Message by Cindy Jacobs: The Tabernacle of David is multigenerational—where are the children? )

## Summer Highlights: Outreach to Local Church, Evangelization and Training

- *Nashville TN:* Our family played for a home group—wonderful response as hearts were healed. Also, ministry at Mel's parents retirement center & key family time.
- *South Jacksonville FL:* Presented to Tim's parents retirement community and led worship & teaching for a 5-Church Prayer Watch—contending for transformation.
- *Leesburg FL:* The Leesburg Vineyard gave us their service (hosted by our dear friend Sandy Lindsay). We sensed God renewing "first love" on Father's Day!
- *St. Petersburg FL:* Unique opportunity to help birth a youth worship team at 1st UMC, downtown St. Pete. Our entire family helped in a 3 day workshop that culminated with a youth-led worship service. Most of the ministry was "modeling". At the end, everyone tasted His goodness as His presence fell.
- *New Orleans Suzuki Music Camp:* Many lives were touched as the Holy Spirit ministered through teachers and students. Melody taught 5 violin/theory classes, Tim taught flute and a Harp & Bowl class. The boys inspired the younger players. After hearing the 3 older Brock brothers play on recital, **a young boy decided not to quit playing violin.**
- *Waynesville NC:* Ministered as a family at Longs Chapel UMC—hearts were unlocked with tears. The Pastor offered for us to return for an evening concert.
- *Jesus at the Beach, Ocean City MD:* Unexpected waves of His presence and a burden for the lost as Jesus truly showed up at the Beach to draw all men to Himself. Thousands heard the music, the gospel (incl. Tim's personal testimony), as they passed by on the OC boardwalk!
- *Cranford NJ:* Started with a precious reunion with old friends (several we hadn't seen since our wedding?) Taught a worship and skills enhancement workshop at the Cranford International House of Prayer, Eastern Gate. We trained about 30 musicians & worship leaders and Samuel taught his first Sound-scape & technology class. Focus was on developing Selah instrumentals that provide opportunities to "find the river" in worship

### **Feast of Tabernacles & Regional 24/3 Prayer Burst (Sept 29<sup>th</sup>—Oct 2<sup>nd</sup>)**

The PC youth hosted our 2<sup>nd</sup> Feast of Tabernacles (in the Cause Bldg on the old PTL Lake) which featured over 60 persons sharing a meal followed by a regional worship leader/team, with spontaneous prayer & wall drawings (youth & children). We then joined in with the Morning Star local church (MS) for a 24/3 Watch of 72+ hours of continuous live worship & prayer, concurrent with the MS Harvest Conference.

### **Strategic Meeting for 24/7 Regional Prayer (Oct 20<sup>th</sup>)**

Immediately following a weekly 4-6pm prayer meeting at MS) 40+ people gathered to share pizza and vision for a 24/7 regional prayer expression. Hosted by MS Intercession, the purpose was exploratory as those gathered represented many strains of the regional prayer community (incl. MS University students). Many had joined in the recent 24/3 “Prayer Burst” (during MS Harvest Fest Conference). Keala Elston (of MS Intercession), shared her vision & some prophetic history— ending with an invitation for others to share their vision for 24/7. We could all feel the prayer cover and a true knitting of hearts with a joyful, yet solemn sense of purpose & destiny—a very encouraging meeting for those in the prayer community who have been praying into regional 24/7.

### **Father/Son South Mountains Campout (Oct 22-24<sup>th</sup>)**

In prayer, we’re recognizing a very real & emerging force to be reckoned with: Fathers & Sons. If anything could go right, it did! The prayer cover was effective as the leadership and involvement of the Holy Spirit was clear. We hiked “up” 1.5 miles to the Upper Shoal Falls back-country area of South Mountains (NC)—for many, their first backpacking experience. There were 23 in all (6 fathers +2 more joining the last day and 15 sons). We shared meals, flashlight tag & Commando, rock-fall (jumping) and rock scrambling. We shared in worship and in the word after breakfasts and dinners. God gave us a new (spontaneous) song from Ps 34 and several fathers shared from the word and imparted a “fathers heart” to every son. A new sense of identity (bonding) was birthed individually and as a unit—even a new name (Fellowship of the Fire).

### **Wedding/Ministry in Florida (Oct 22-24<sup>th</sup>)**

One of the worship team leaders from UMC Starke organized the music for an elaborate wedding at the World Golf Resort in St. Augustine. The Presence of the Lord ministered to hearts as Melody played in the ceremony. She also ministered on Sunday a.m. with several solos as well as with the wonderful worship team at UMC Starke. Sunday afternoon, she was able to connect with the dedicated leaders of Jacksonville House of Prayer along with Grandpa Al and Grandma Bunny Brock who live nearby. Many divine appointments made the weekend extra special. We are exploring opportunities to conduct music skill-enhancement workshops in this region.
