They removed built up scar tissue from a past surgery when she almost lost her life as an 18 year old in 1946. This hopefully will resolve GI track issues bothering her for many years!

She now has a permanent catheter which is such a blessing. Instead of spending hours in the bathroom, she will be able to exercise and go to the prayer room. It is such a blessing to have her and we love praying with her. She is now in rehab & with us in Kansas City until June 2020.

### Samuel:

Samuel and Suzanne are planning to get married at the end of the summer in Canada. He continues to teach online, work with his electric string quartet and navigate visa challenges.

This summer, he plans to return to Israel to teach at the Dor Haba camp, training Israeli and Arab youth in worship and prayer, and to serve at Succat Hallel. We are praying for partners in helping with his airfare and housing, he needs to raise \$2,000 by June 1.
